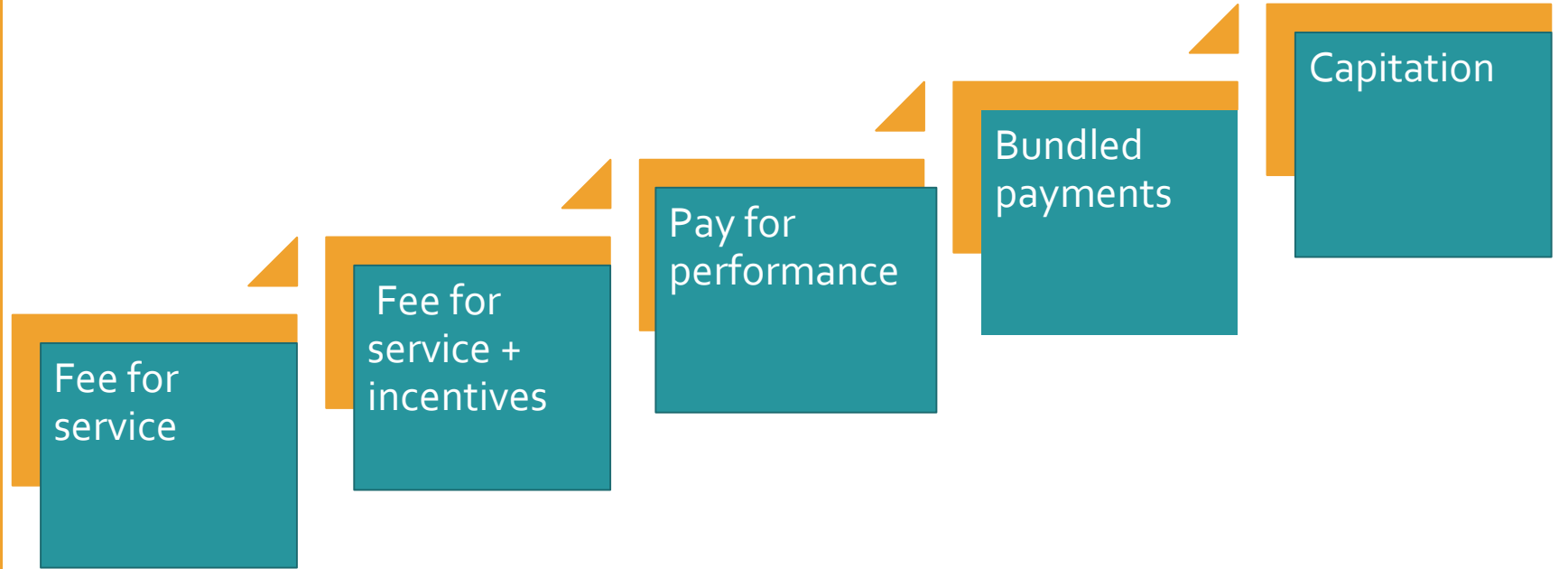

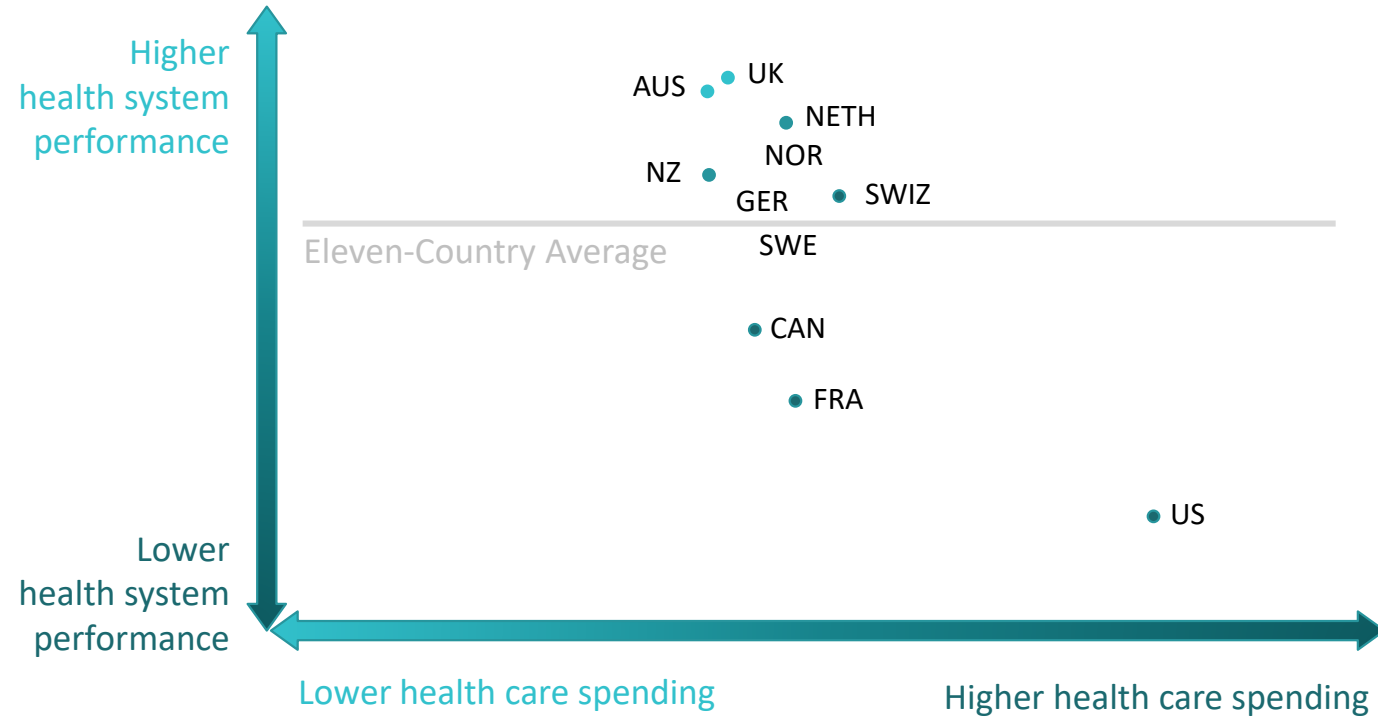

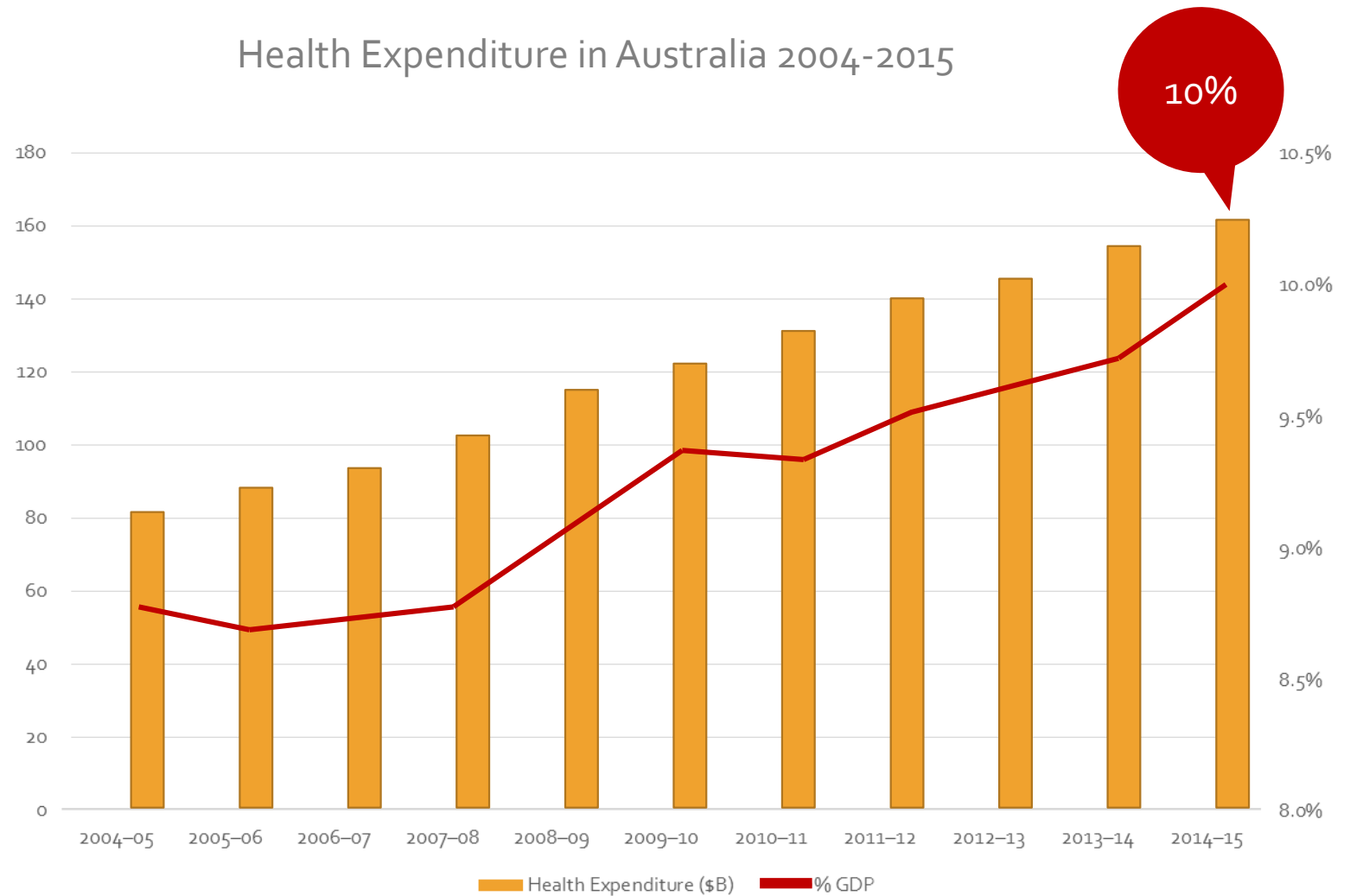


Note: Health care spending as a percent of GDP

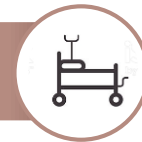
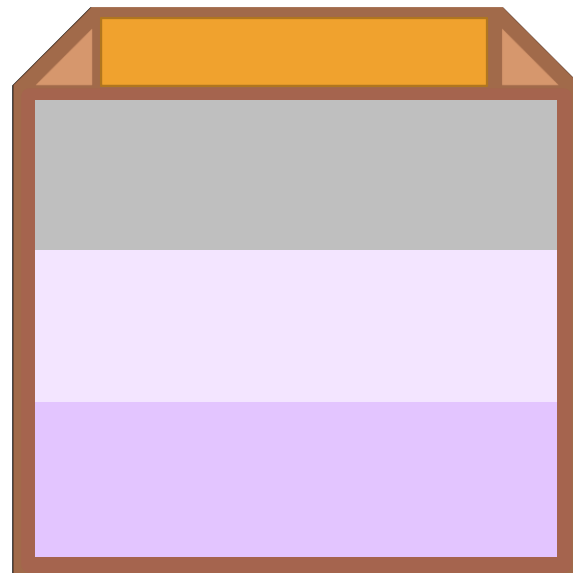

List of Hospital Acquired Complications (HACs)

No.	Complication
1	Pressure injury
2	Falls resulting in fracture or other intracranial injury
3	Healthcare associated infection
4	Surgical complications requiring unplanned return to theatre
5	Unplanned intensive care unit admission
6	Respiratory complications
7	Venous thromboembolism
8	Renal failure
9	Gastrointestinal bleeding
10	Medication complications
11	Delirium
12	Persistent incontinence
13	Malnutrition
14	Cardiac complications
15	Third and fourth degree perineal laceration during delivery
16	Neonatal birth trauma

- Blood Stream Infection
- Central line associated BSI
- Peripheral line associated BSI
- Prosthetic associated infection
- Pneumonia
